M4096 TO DISCUSS THE USE OF COMMUNITY GRANTS

Council were joined by Fred Weston Community Action Lead MCC to discuss the possible use of a £5,000 grant to fund a community led project in the Lawrence Crescent Area of Caerwent. Fred has already had an initial meeting with County Councillor Phil Murphy and Revd. Kay Denly to explain that this was a participatory budget which would be earmarked for a project in a small area (micro geography-street level)

It will involve posting letters through the neighbourhood inviting residents to decide on what they would like to spend the money on and then a Public Vote likely to be held at the Community Centre.

A number of questions were asked by the councillors and also a number of suggestions as to how the grant might be used.

The outcomes are very much dependent on community participation criteria. The Community Action Lead explained that the funding would be held by the Community Council if agreed and the project would begin fairly swiftly. Council were in support of the proposals and agreed that we would hold the funding in our bank account.

M4100 NOTE ANY UPDATES ON FACE-TO-FACE MEETINGS

Councillor Evans reported that the new false ceiling is due to be installed in May, thereby securing adequate soundproofing. This could mean that meetings will return to face to face in the Summer.

Councillor Guscott asked why the Village Hall could not be used and Councillor Evans explained that the configuration of rooms and the many bookings make it impossible for meetings to be held there satisfactorily on a regular basis.

M4101 THE ENVIRONMENTAL (WALES) ACT 2026 SECTION 6 REPORTING

Councillor Swift continues to work on this and is researching how other councils are presenting their findings. The report will need to be quite detailed to fulfil the statutory requirements. To remain on the agenda for next time.

M4102 TO NOTE DOG BIN CHANGE AT LAWRENCE CRESCENT

The Community Council face book page has been updated on this. Clerk attended Give Dog Fouling the Red Card Meeting (Remotely) Council noted.

M4103 TO CONSIDER AND AGREE DOG CONTROLS PROPOSED FOR A PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER IN THE COMMUNITY

Council have received a request from Sue Parkinson on behalf of the Grounds and Cleaning Team to respond to the following questions

- a) Consider and advise me if agree or disagree with the proposals.
- b) Are there any additional Dogs on Leads or Dog Exclusion Areas proposed? If so please advise of where and the reason(s) why.
- c) If a PSPO is implemented the cost of signage will need to be met by the landowner / lessee. I have indicated above the sites I understand belong to the community council, approx. number of signs needed and approx. cost. While these will need further consideration in due course, are these indicative costs agreeable?

There was an in depth discussion and councillors whilst agreeing with the proposals were concerned how they were going to be enforced. We already have signs in place in the three play areas we own. Councillor Evans explained that in the past the PSPOS were better known as Bye Laws.

Clerk to draft a response with help of the council. Clerk will also ask for more information which will inform our response.

M4104 DOG FOULING AT HIGHFIELD BUNGALOWS, ROMAN WALLS AND CAERWENT MEADOWS

Clerk had circulated the notes from the 'Give Dog Fouling The Red Card' meeting. A County Councillor from Chepstow had raised the issue of the problem at Highfield at the meeting and this has been noted as a "Hot Spot" Councillors discussed the use of more signage and whether this required permission and whether there were any costs involved.

It was considered whether we would put forward areas of Caerwent that receive the most dog fouling as candidates for the Council Action Day which takes place again in the Autumn.
